### **Project Record Books**

Record books are a great way to document your project and keep records of what you participated in throughout the 4-H year. Project Record Books are DUE FEBRUARY 19th to be eligible for state competition. Keep in mind that you are finishing up the 2019 year and your age category should match how old you were on January 1st, 2019. ## 2020 Winter Enrichment

Who: Any active 4-H teen member

What: Winter Enrichment is a leadership opportunity for teens to collaborate with other youth across our district. Teens will attend various workshops, have lunch together, and go to a trampoline park (extra waiver to be signed).

When/Where: Saturday, January 11th. We will load the van in the Extension parking lot between 8:30 and 8:45am. We will return around 5pm. The event will take place at the Union County Center and local trampoline park.

Registration: Please come to the office, 123 Caroline St. to pay \$20 and sign the trampoline park waiver by JANUARY 3rd. You must also be currently enrolled in 4honline to travel.

Please read if you plan to participate in the 2020 poultry show! This year, in order for laying hens to be slightly older at show time, layers and broilers will be picked up on different days. Layer chicks will be picked up between February 3rd and 10rd. A confirmed pick up date will be given to those who order birds after the order has been placed. You can order up to 5 birds of each kind for each showman. The breeds in competition this year are Rhode Island Reds and Black Laced Golden Wyandotte. Both make great backyard birds but please research each breed before making your selection. Each layer will cost \$3.50. You are responsible for the care of this bird for the remainder of its life. If you are interested in broilers, pickup for them will be Friday, March 13rd between 4:00 and 6:00pm. You can receive up to 10 birds per showman. Meat bird competitors should understand that they must surrender their birds the night of the show for processing. The meat will be donated to a local food bank. Each broiler is \$2.00. By purchasing birds, you are confirming that you will participate in the 4-H Poultry Show and complete a record book on your poultry project. The record book will be given to you on the day you pick up your chicks. If you are showing multiple breeds, the record book can be completed on one of those breeds or all of them. Oder deadline is January 6a. If you have any questions about the poultry project or show, please let me know.

# **Important Guidelines**

In order for youth to be considered an "active" 4-H'er in Richmond County and eligible for competition, the following requirements must be met on an annual basis. The 4-H year runs from January to December and the 4-H age is set as of January 1.

**Enrollment Forms:** A completed enrollment packet must be completed online at <a href="www.4-honline.com">www.4-honline.com</a> for the current year. The enrollment packet consists of the NC 4-H Enrollment Form, acknowledgement of the NC 4-H Code of Conduct, NC 4-H Medical Information, and NC 4-H Photo/Video Consent. This online form does not yet sync with our camps. Therefore, additional paperwork will be required for any overnight camping experience.

- **4-H Achievement:** All youth enrolled in Richmond County 4-H must complete and submit a Project Record Book in any program area OR participate in the 4-H Presentation Program (county activity day) on at least the county level.
- **4-H Participation:** All youth enrolled in Richmond County 4-H must participate in at least one event, outside your discipline, at County, District, or State level. Examples: Summer Fun, 4-H Congress, District Retreats, Teen Council, Workshops, day or resident camps, or 4-H Achievement Night.
- **4-H Community Service:** All youth enrolled in Richmond County 4-H must participate in a minimum of ONE community service project. (Parades and family chores do not count)
- **4-H Club Enrollment:** All youth enrolled in Richmond County 4-H must attend 80% of their club meetings, if enrolled in a club. If you are a member at large, not part of a club, you must attend at least 2 county-wide 4-H events, and if 13 or older, must attend 5 or more Teen Council meetings.
- **4-H Competition:** Cloverbud youth (ages 5-7) can participate in competitions but are NOT COMPETITIVE.

PLEASE NOTE: Club leaders must have 4-H Agent approval on all documentation such as eligibility cards, tournament participation, and anything else required for competition.

The event will be held January 31 - February 2, 2020 at the Hilton Durham near Duke University. Registration deadline in January 6th. The South Central District is responsible for registration. Please be collecting items to put in registration bags. We are also responsible for decorating tables. More info to follow. I will pay for Saturday only. If you want to attend the entire event, you provide your own travel and are responsible for the remainder of the cost.
